From the Editors:


Can you believe we are already in the month of November and December is coming up in just a few more weeks? This year has flown by, and now the holiday season is upon us.

Bible Lesson:

Channon Fox did a wonderful job of leading the kids in the Bible Lesson portion at VBS. You could feel the Holy Spirit's presence as she taught the first night about God's greatest gift, the birth of Jesus, and the second night on how Jesus showed His love in giving up His life for us. It was touching to hear the children learn about their sins being like rocks that weigh us down, and that we are all to give them to God and ask for forgiveness. The kids then took rocks and laid them at the foot of a cross, each being mindful and quiet as we heard each rock fall into place there. It was a very touching moment for all.

Craft Room:

Instead of your typical VBS craft, we did a *Project with a Purpose* to help those less fortunate. We talked about caring for those who are in need, and that it is God's will for us to help others. The kids decorated paper bags with crayons, markers, buttons, and pompoms. Some wrote messages to the recipients as well. Then baggies with dried beans and spices were added, along with a recipe. These bags were donated to *Wesley House*, a non-profit organization that serves the senior community. The food will be donated to the older adults who come to the center. *Wesley House* was very excited to receive the donations.

Snacks:

Dof course everyone was starving when they entered the FLC. Several of the ladies volunteered to man the kitchen, and they served up delicious corndogs and chips the first night and wonderful chicken nuggets and chips the second night, and of course cookies both nights as well. This was so exciting for the kids... food always is, for all of us!

On Sunday, our morning worship service highlighted the music and the lessons shared with everyone on Friday and Saturday evening. Pastor Donald and Rawhide McSpur shared about what gift God gave us, and Pastor Donald did an object lesson that showed just how a sinful heart is made clean by God's forgiveness.

After service we all went to the FLC where our *Block Party* was on! In addition to music, there was a *Chili Cook-off*. Our first place winner was *Amanda Russell*, who now has bragging rights over her husband for a long time. She won a Food City gift card. Our second place winner was *Charles Leger*, who also won a Food City gift card. All the chili in the cook-off was great, especially when paired with hot dogs.

We were so excited to see our very first VBS, and can't wait until the next one! Many thanks to Pastor Donald, and all who volunteered - from the beginning stages of preparation to cleaning up the confetti and hay all over the sanctuary floor. We couldn't have done it without every person's help!
