The Prophetic Meaning of 2020 and 5780, by Perry Stone (begin at 00:53:29)

Part 1: The Gregorian year 2020

On the Gregorian calendar we are beginning the year 2020.

The Jewish calendar, as of Rosh Hashanah (September 29, 2019), is now the year 5780.

When God is dealing with the Gentiles, of which He is, He uses traditionally the Gentile calendar. However, the Jewish calendar every year holds a prophetic key to it *if* we are in a prophetic season.

Gematria/Gimatria: *is an alphanumeric code of assigning a numerical value to a name, word or phrase based on its letters. (Wikipedia)*

The Bible has thousands of number references, but there are about 12 total that stand out. Some include: 6, 70, 40...

The Old Testament was written in the Hebrew language, portions of Daniel in the Aramaic, and the New Testament was written in the Koine Greek (common Greek).

The Hebrew alphabet has 22 individual letters. It does not have vowels. In modern Hebrew there are dots that are put above and below the letters to represent the sound that should be used with it.

There are two alphabets – Hebrew and Greek – where the alphabetic letters have a numerical value as well. In the earliest days, a number could represent a letter of the alphabet. A large number, like 150, would be the total of two, three, or four letters of that alphabet, because each specific letter has a numerical value.

In a prophetic season, this system (gematria) works. It does not work all the time.

In the Bible there are numerous numbers Some of those that are significant are:

- 7:
 - On the 7th day the walls of Jericho fell
 - The 7th angel in the book of Revelation cries, “It is finished!”
 - 7 trumpets
 - 7 vials
 - 7 churches of Asia Minor
 - The number 7 always means **completion of something**.
 - ***It’s called the perfect number because it’s connected to spiritual things and to the things of God.***
 - 7 saying Jesus said from the cross, the last one being, “It is finished.”
- 40:
 - ***The number of testing***
 - Goliath taunted Israel for 40 days
 - It rained on earth for 40 days and 40 nights
 - Jesus fasted for 40 days and was tempted of the devil during that time
- 70:


- There were 70 elders assigned by Moses
- There were 70 members of the Jewish Sanhedrin
- There were 70 that were appointed by Jesus to go out two-by-two to carry the gospel
- Jeremiah 25:11 tells of 70 years of captivity in Babylon

All Biblical numbers:

1. have meaning
2. it is the same meaning throughout the entire Bible
 - 6:
 - always the number of man
 - the mark of the beast is 666
 - when they bowed to worship the image there were 6 instruments used
 - the image was 6 cubits high [Daniel 3:1]

The Hebrew alphabet, which has 22 individual letters, has a number value and can conceal clues of future events.

As an example:

- In the 2016 election for president #45
 - If you look at the number 45 in Hebrew, it is the letters  (hey, mem) – written/read r-l
 - Mem's value in Hebrew is 40. Hey's value in Hebrew is 5. So together they are 45.
 - If you take the meaning of the number 45, it is two letters [mem hey]. "Mem hey" is something said in Israel all the time. It means: **"What?"**
 - It was predicted that when the 45th president was elected, the news media would be saying, *"What? How did this happen?"*

This does not happen all the time, but it does happen during significant prophetic seasons.

What we are going to do is take the Jewish year 5780 and the Gregorian year 2020 and break them both down in this same fashion.

Hermeneutics – the law of interpreting scripture – has four major parts:

1. literal interpretation
 - a. when the plain sense of the scripture makes sense, seek no other sense
2. symbols
 - a. serpent represents satan
 - b. dove represents the Holy Spirit
3. allegorical
4. metaphorical

Hebrew:

- There are 22 letters in the Hebrew alphabet.
- These letters all have a different form or shape which is significant.
- Paleo Hebrew is the oldest form of Hebrew – of which the Torah was written in

- Each letter of the alphabet also has a symbol it represents
 - the very earliest Hebrew letter is aleph, and if you go back and look at the original form, it looks different than what an aleph looks like now:

Modern aleph: Paleo aleph:



- It looked like the head of an animal. So in the beginning, aleph represented an ox.
 - You can go all the way through the alphabet and you have symbols where one letters represents a camel, or one represents a door, or one is like a house, etc. Pictures could be: animals, parts of the body, things you would build in the ancient days.
- What we will look at is the calculation of the year and transfer it back to a letter of the alphabet that is that value, then give the symbol that that represents to see if there is a pattern or a meaning here.
- Each letter has a number assigned to it.

- All the letters of the Hebrew alphabet have a specific numerical value

Greek:

- The Greek alphabet has 24 letters, but the Greek also has a numerical value just like Hebrew
- Example:

Revelation 13:18

¹⁸ Here is wisdom. Let him that hath understanding count the number of the beast: for it is the number of a man; and his number is Six hundred threescore and six.

- If you go back to the original translation of the Greek it does not say 666 – it says three Greek letters. The first Greek letter’s value is 600. The second Greek letter’s value is 60. The third letter’s value is 6. When you put them together it reads 666.

Previous years' meanings for OCI:

- 2012 – year of building the house (OCI building was built)
- 2013 – year of the camels (miraculous provisions came to fund the building)
- 2014 – year of the door (doors opening for the ministry)
- 2018 – new birth and new life (OCI had 16 births and adoptions that year)
- 2019:
 - 9 is the letter tet ט
 - tet is the serpent
 - this would be the year the snakes would come out of the basket

We are now in the Jewish year 5780 and the Gregorian year 2020. What do they hold for us?

2020:

- two 20's
- 20 is the Hebrew letter kaf/kaph כ
- The picture represents a hand, but specifically the palm of the hand.
- 20 20 | kaf kaf | hand hand
 - represents two palms lifted up
- kaf is a letter that has several versions of it
 - it is called the double letter – meaning it appears in one form, but changes form at the end of a word.
 - whatever form it is in, the numerical value is still the same – 20
- based on the pictograph, the year 2020 is two hands lifted
 - the prophetic imagery is the laying on of hands
 - [law of first mention: the first time something is mentioned it sets the pattern for it throughout the Bible]
 - the lamb in Exodus 12 is a picture of Jesus in the New Testament
 - satan in the garden as a serpent is a picture of him being a serpent throughout the Bible
 - the law of first mention of the two hands has to deal with Jacob when he blessed his grandchildren (Genesis 48)
- the tenth letter of the alphabet is yod י
 - The first letter of God's sacred name in Hebrew: [r-l: yod hey vav hey] יהוה
 - The yod is a Y transliterated in English, but we also in English use that sound as the J.
 - Jacob | Yaakov
 - Judah | Yudah
 - Jerusalem | Yerushelim
 -
 - Every name in the Bible that begins with the J in English begins with the letter yod in Hebrew, which is the tenth letter.

- Israel | Yisrael:
 - Starts with an I, but also begins with the letter yod in Hebrew:
 - [r-l: yod – shin – resh – aleph – lamed] יִשְׂרָאֵל
 - yod is the smallest letter in the Hebrew alphabet
 - lamed is the tallest letter in the Hebrew alphabet
 - [shin is the letter that represents God]
 - So God says to Israel in their name: “I will begin you small with one man, but I will make you the greatest/tallest nation in the earth one day.”
- The letter yod represents the hand ך
 - kaf represents the palm
 - yod represents the hand
- yod yod | hand hand | 10 + 10 + 20 | kaf is the 20th, which is the palm
- Joseph goes to Egypt. Ends up being sold. Gets falsely accused in Potipher’s house. Ends up going to prison. Gets out of prison and gets married to an Egyptian woman. Has two sons by her: Ephraim and Manasseh.
 - Ephraim means: fruitful in the land of my affliction
 - Manasseh means: You Lord have made me to forget my suffering
 - So Joseph has two boys whose names together mean: You’ve made me forget, but also in the land You have made me fruitful.
 - The key to coming out of bondage is this: you must first forget those things which are behind and reach for the things that are before.
 - Paul had to forget who he was –a Pharisee, an executor of Christians. He had to lay it all aside. He could not go into the ministry in condemnation.
 - So here the first step is: God has made me forget my trouble, but now God has made me fruitful
 - When you are willing to forget your past, God is willing to take you in your future and make you fruitful.
 - Jacob finds out Joseph is alive and he goes to find him, saying he will see his son then die. He gets there and finds that Joseph has two kids, Jacob’s spirit is revived, and he lives another 17 years.
 - Joseph realizes these people are going to go back to the land of Israel one day. Jacob said to Joseph that the two sons born in Egypt would be his – he was saying he was going to adopt these boys born in the bondage of Egypt, in a place that is not even in covenant with God. He is going to adopt those kids who have no covenant – who have no relationship – those who know nothing about Abraham and Isaac. He is going to adopt them and show them that God almighty has an inheritance for those who are going to come out of Egyptian bondage with God’s people.

Genesis 48:14

¹⁴ And Israel stretched out his right hand, and laid it upon Ephraim's head, who was the younger, and his left hand upon Manasseh's head, guiding his hands wittingly; for Manasseh was the firstborn.

- The children were born in Egypt, not the promised land.
- Those that were born in the promised land were born under covenant and were free.
- Those that were born in Egypt were born in the territory of idolatry, paganism, satanic powers, demonic bondage, false gods, and false worship.
- But the man of God who is the older man comes along and takes his hands, and takes a group of kids who are alien to those in Israel, but are not alien to God.
- **God says: I'm taking my hands this year and I'm laying my hands on your head as a father of this nation.**
 - God says to lay your hands on these kids and say: you might have been born in Egypt, but God's got an inheritance for you.
 - This is going to be the year when the sons and the daughters who were born in captivity to the flesh and to the pornography and to drugs and alcohol, are going to have hands of the older ones laid on them and they will be delivered.

Genesis 48:16

¹⁶The Angel which redeemed me from all evil, bless the lads; and let my name be named on them, and the name of my fathers Abraham and Isaac; and **let them grow into a multitude in the midst of the earth.**

- Get your hands ready – this is the year to start blessing stuff.
- With your two hands – you worship God.
- When you lay hands on people, you must first be in the presence of God. You must first encounter the presence. Then you lay hands upon the people.
 - We're going to have to lay hands on a whole generation this year to get them ready for the inheritance that God has for them.
- On the Day of Atonement the priests took both hands and laid them around the horns of the altar and transferred the sin that was on the people to a goat by forming his hands into that letter kaf כ.
- When the priesthood was transferred, the high priest laid hands on his son, whispered how you pronounce the sacred name of God into his ear, and then transferred the ministry of the priesthood to his son by laying on of hands.
- The patriarchs blessed their children by laying hands on them and speaking a prophetic word.
 - In the New Testament you minister healing by the laying on of hands.
 - You minister the Holy Spirit baptism through the laying on of hands.
 - You ordain ministers by the laying on of hands.
 - You transfer gifts by the laying on of hands.
- There is a hungry generation out there.

II Timothy 1:6

⁶Therefore I remind you to stir up the gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands

- ***You've got to impart before you depart.***
 - That's what Elijah did – he imparted to Elisha, the younger man, before he left this planet.
- There are mantles out there that are still floating around. Nobody's picked them up yet because they haven't been willing to pay the price for that mantle.
- In this law of first mention, you see that HANDS plural is connected to the blessing that Jacob gave to these kids - there has to be a transfer. We cannot let the older saints in our churches die. What are we doing with the anointing they had?
- There are some anointings out there just waiting to be grabbed.
- It's not just about going to church. It's not just about being saved. There's a 2020 anointing coming that's got *kaf kaf* connected – *hand hand* connected – we need to get our hands ready and start praying for these young people.

Joel 2:28

²⁸ “And it shall come to pass afterward that I will pour out My Spirit on all flesh; Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, Your old men shall dream dreams, Your young men shall see visions.

- Jacob (the father) laid his hands on the children (Ephraim and Manasseh) and he spoke that they would not be in Egypt/bondage/captivity forever. He not only broke Egypt off of them, he spoke and prophesied blessing on top of them.
- God is going to pour out His Spirit upon all flesh!
- When this group that he's blessing lived in Egypt, went into bondage, saw the plagues, and came out, Ephraim and Manasseh came out with thousands of sons. When they got to their inheritance in the promised land after 40 years there are two old men:
 - Joshua is 80 and Caleb is 85 – and they were running giants off that no one else wanted to mess with
 - Everyone else with them is under 40
 - The ones leading the promise to eventually take their land back are two old men.
 - Before Joshua got it, another old man [Moses] of 120 years laid his hands on him and said God wasn't going to let him go over, but that Joshua would take them in. Moses gave him everything he had by the laying on of hands.
- The tribal territory of Ephraim and Manasseh is the area of Gilgal. It's the area where Israel camped before they got the inheritance.
 - Not only was it the land that they inherited, but the Gentile nations that became Christian nations can be traced back to coming out of the tribes of Ephraim and Manasseh.
 - One old man's blessing kept going long after they were dead, and when they had kids it kept on going, and when they had kids it kept on going... and on and on. We're living today under a blessing of an old man [Jacob] that prophesied that we be fruitful and multiply.
- The shape of the Hebrew letter kaf/kaph looks like a dove with open wings.



- About the dove:
 - In most other birds, the tips of the wings point to the tail, but on the dove they point to the head. The dove represents the Holy Spirit because he doesn't try to point you anywhere else except to the head – God.
 - A dove has 9 main feathers on its left wing, and 9 main feathers on its right wing – you have 9 gifts of the spirit and you have 9 fruits of the spirit
 - The tail of a dove has five main tail feathers that balance it – the fivefold ministry gifts
- It says that the spirit of God at Jesus' baptism came on him and hovered like a dove. It looked like the Hebrew letter Kaf hovering over Him, because God was putting His hand on His son through the anointing.

Matthew 3:16

¹⁶When He had been baptized, Jesus came up immediately from the water; and behold, the heavens were opened to Him, and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting upon Him.

- In the Gentile year 2020:
 - worship is with the hands
 - laying on of hands is with the hands
 - There are entire nations that the church is under 35 years of age
 - According to Malachi there must be spiritual fathers
 - You're not a spiritual father just because you're an older man.
 - Young men under 30 can be a natural father, but not a spiritual father, because they don't have the wisdom yet.
 - Ephraim and Manasseh were transferred from bondage to life and inheritance.
 - For the younger generation, this is their year to get from God their gifts and anointings and learn to walk in the things of the spirit like they have not done up until this point.
