All of us are guilty of trying to impress God.

How to Impress God:

Don't try to impress God

Luke 18:10-12

¹⁰ "Two men went up to the temple to pray, One a Pharisee, and the other a tax collector.

¹¹ The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people—robbers, evildoers, adulterers

¹² I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get.'

His religion had no heart.

He was a double tither.

How to Impress God:

1. Don't try to impress God

Notice five times he said "I" in just two verses:

¹⁰ Two men went up to the temple to pray, One a Pharisee, and the other a tax collector.

¹¹ The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people—robbers, evildoers, adulterers

C. S. Lewis once said:

"A proud man is always looking down on things and people; and of course, as long as you are looking down, you can't see something that's above you."

Romans 3:23

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

We have all sinned and fallen short of the Glory of God

How to Impress God:

1. Don't try to impress God
2. Humility

This tax collector was humble. You could see it in his feet. V.13 says, "And the tax collector, standing afar off,"

Palms 34:18

The Lord is near to those who have a broken heart, and saves such as have a contrite spirit.

Merciful: Hebrew word "kippur" which literally mean "atonement"

Luke 18:14

I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be abased, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.
